We are looking for an individual who will coordinate and design Indigenous interpretive programming in conjunction with the Riverbank Discovery Centre tour programs and cultural events.

The Indigenous Interpretive Tour Guide Programmers would create and build the Indigenous interpretive program in conjunction with the Riverbank Discovery Centre's programs on the land and with the riverbank. Work activities would include compiling Elder stories, researching history and knowledge, developing program curriculum, and assisting with planning of events at the Riverbank Discovery Centre. The local priority of preserving and revitalizing Indigenous history of the land and of the Assiniboine River are important factors in these positions and for the community. This summer career position is part of a team that encourages the City of Brandon and surrounding area to support cultural growth when developing strategic directions and programming. The summer career position will work in partnership to tell the stories of the First Nations and Metis peoples on the land and the river.

- A student enrolled in a University degree or college diploma/certificate program returning to full time studies in the fall, with a focus in one of the following: marketing, communications, public relations, geography, archeology, botany, native studies, history and humanities
- Candidates must be between 18-30 years old

- A person with an interest in Indigenous history and heritage of Brandon and the surrounding region
